1900 Forrest Avenue Update

With the funds in hand for purchasing the nearly 4 acres to be added to Lockeland Springs Park, Trust for Public Land is currently finalizing the real estate due diligence for the park expansion property with Metro Parks staff. Once the documentation for the property is approved, the transaction will go before the Metro Parks Board for approval and then to Metro Council for final approval. We're anticipating a fall closing of the acquisition and a community celebration to follow soon!

While acquiring the property is the first key step, Lockeland Springs Park needs your support. We're raising funds to create the local park steward organization, Friends of Lockeland Springs Park, a long-term vision for the expanded park, clean up new park property, and repair the damage the park sustained in 2020.

We're within \$6,000 of our campaign goal for this effort, and you can donate today using this nifty QR code.



PICKLEBALL MAKES ITS WAY TO SHELBY BOTTOMS

If you've been by the Shelby Community Center lately, you may have noticed some colorful new lines on the outdoor tennis courts. Those are for pickleball! Metro Nashville Parks and Recreation now has 8 beautiful pickleball courts painted and ready to play. Huge thanks to community volunteers for making it happen.

Pickleball is a fast-growing sport that is easy to learn and fun for all ages. Invented on Bainbridge Island, Washington in 1965, pickleball combines elements of tennis, badminton, and ping-pong. It is played on a badminton-sized court (smaller than a tennis court) using a paddle (slightly larger than a ping pong paddle) and a plastic ball with holes (similar to a wiffle ball).

Pickleball can be played in singles or doubles and owes its popularity to being quick to learn, easy on the body, and a lot of fun! Stop by Shelby Community Center and try your hand at pickleball soon! For more information on the sport, visit usapickleball.org.

Sweet Sixteenth

The love story of Dan and Ellen Einstein is one that almost every neighbor with a sweet tooth knows well. Having relocated to East Nashville from Los Angeles in the 1990s, the Einsteins had an epiphany after the 1998 tornado that started the chain of events that led to them renovate the iconic house on the corner of 16th and Ordway into the building that is now Sweet 16th Bakery. In May of 2004, the bakery first opened its doors (happy 18th birthday!!!), and since then, there has been a steady stream of delicious savory and sweet treats spilling out onto the streets of our neighborhood.

While Sweet 16th closed briefly due to the pandemic lockdowns, the bakery managed to stay open, albeit as a take-out only establishment. Throughout it all, the bakery has maintained a thriving made-to-order business. In fact, if you've never had one of their cakes (give them adequate lead time when you order), you are missing one of life's richest pleasures.

Tragically, in January of 2022, Dan Einstein died after a long illness. The outpouring from the community was extraordinary— the wall of good wishes was featured on the news, along with the record-breaking GoFundMe campaign that allowed Ellen to be able to close temporarily without losing any of her staff. The bakery reopened yet again, and on May 1, the community had a celebration of Dan's life right there on Ordway between 16th and 17th. The sky was blue, the music was fabulous, the food was extra tasty, and the hugs were long and full of the love that binds us all to this incredible couple and their beautiful bakery that has been a second home to so many of us.
